



## Quotes from Saturday's Third Round August 13, 2005

### 87<sup>th</sup> PGA Championship – Baltusrol Golf Club

#### **Stewart Cink (4-under par 66 to move to 1-under par 209)**

(On tee time) "I think I had the worst tee time possible as far as comfort level out there at 9:50 this morning. The humidity, no breeze, it's just dreadful."

(On how much water he drank today) "I probably went through about six or seven (bottles), including two complete Imino Vital sports mixes."

(On level of heat on a scale of 1 to 10) "Probably about an eight, because we've played in some hot stuff but this year this might be up at the very top. I don't remember playing anywhere much hotter except for maybe Pinehurst practice rounds. This was up there and when you are actually competing against a golf course like this and against a field like this in a major, your temperature on the inside goes up a little bit, too. So, the heat index doesn't even say it all."

(On whether he modifies his practice routine before a round on a day like this) "Not before but afterwards. Normally everyone out here will go out and practice after, but today the range may be pretty lonely once the last group tees off."

(On getting up and down on No. 4) "Yeah that was a pretty good putt there. Sometimes you walk on the green and you get the feeling that you're going to knock it in no matter where you are. That was one of those putts where it was a difficult-looking putt that honestly wasn't that hard of a putt to get really close because it was uphill and it broke a little to the left. I had a pretty good feeling before I even stepped over the ball."

(On going 1-under on the front with the "easier" back nine still to come) "They talk about that, the easy side. There is no easy side. If you're executing your shots well, the back nine will be open to birdies because you'll have shorter shots to the green but all in all, yeah, I played really well on the front and made some putts. On the back nine, I played well, too, but didn't make any putts and I think I got out of there on the back with 1-under. Under par on any nine at any point of this championship is going to be pretty good."

(On whether he had a number in mind that he wanted to shoot today) "I'm not a numbers guy. I just going out there to grind my rear end off on every single shot and try to get as low as I can go and whatever number that turns out to be, then that's the best I can do for the day. I don't try to target myself for any number."

### **Dudley Hart (4-under par 66 to move to 1-under 209)**

(On his birdie on No. 4) "I hit a good 5-iron in there just a nice little draw and it just happened to land on the ridge in a perfect spot and ended up about eight feet. I had an easy putt right-to-left uphill and I just knocked it in. They have great par 3s on this golf course. They all have pretty good length and none of them are easy. That's a good hole. It's a dangerous shot and if you bail on it a little bit, make sure you get over the water. You just have to stand up to a shot and be committed with it."

(On his round overall) "I had a little bit of everything. I hit a few fairways. I still missed a few but there are certain holes you can miss the fairway on and still have a chance and there are other holes that if you miss, you don't have a chance. I hit most of the long ones. On those 500-yarders, you don't want to miss those. I missed a couple on the par-5s coming in, but there you still have a chance to do something there. I putted pretty well also. I hadn't made a lot of putts during the week, most of what you would expect to make."

### **Michael Campbell (1-under par 69 to move to even-par 210)**

(On his position after the third round) "It was good today. Hopefully I'm still in striking distance from the rest of the leaders. Tomorrow's a new day and hopefully I will shoot well tomorrow."

(On his 14 pars in the third round) "Something didn't fall my way today unfortunately. I had a lot of shots close to the hole today, but I just didn't convert them into birdies. Hopefully I will put together another round like that and the putts will drop tomorrow."

### **Charles Howell III (2-under par 68 to move to 1-under par 209)**

(On his hole-in-one) "That's the first hole in one I've had in a tournament. I couldn't think of a better place to have it than a major. It was absolutely the perfect club when I walked on the tee because it had a little bit of wind helping. But the longer it took from the time I walked on to the tee to hitting it, the wind was dying a little bit and then I wasn't sure it was the right club. However, it wound up being the right club, a 7-iron, 194 yards."

(On his round) "If I could have driven the ball a little straighter, I could have gotten things going a little. If you drive the fairways out here you can really take advantage of it. The golf course is playing so fairly. We were looking at the pin sheets and seeing six and five off the edges when you're used to seeing two and three which is to their (PGA) credit because you have a chance to make some birdies."

(On if was surprised by a score of 7-under 63) "I think if you drive it in the fairways, you can shoot it. There's plenty of holes out there where you're hitting short irons into. There's only a few of the par 4s that are long, but then again from the fairways the ball is running out a lot. I've hit 7-iron from the fairway on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole the last three days."

### **Jesper Parnevik (2-over par 72 to move to 1-under par 209)**

(On his round) "Oh, it was just a very frustrating round. I had three three-putts and one birdie. Two-over par, not much else to say."

(On the leaderboard and tomorrow's final round) "I need to look at the leaderboard to see what everyone is doing. Thomas Bjorn played an unbelievable round today. I think that's probably one of the year's best rounds so far. Sixty-three with these pins, that's pretty impressive. So, I'm sure he's feeling good for tomorrow now. I don't know, for myself, I just need to hole a few more putts tomorrow and hope the other guys don't do the same."

### **Kenny Perry (Even-par 70 to move to 1-under par 209)**

(On still being in the hunt) "I'm only four behind (at the time). It's okay. I'll have to shoot something special tomorrow although maybe I'm too far back. I had my chances and blew it."

(On how the course played today) "It's not playing much different. The greens were much firmer and faster but the rough was still the same."

(On the heat during the round) "It was nice out there. A cloud cover rolled in there and it was beautiful for us this afternoon."

(On types of player atop the leaderboard) "They're all different players. You see long hitters, you see short hitters. You see a mix of players this week. If you can hit it in the fairway, you can score out here. That's the whole bottom line, the tee shot."

### **Retief Goosen (1-under par 69 to move to 3-under par 207)**

(On his third round) "Once again, I struggled with my driving and missed a lot of fairways. I holed a few good putts, but I wasn't hitting enough fairways to give myself enough chances."

(On how he stands after three rounds) "We'll have to wait and see. Hopefully, I'm only four behind."

(On what he needs to do on Sunday) "You have to hit the fairways around here to give yourself a chance, so hopefully I will drive it a lot better tomorrow. Then I have to make sure I get my irons in there close so I will have opportunities to score."
