FLASH INTERVIEW WITH:

GEOFF OGILVY

Q. Just a disappointing day all around?

GEOFF OGILVY: Yeah, not very good. I probably wasn't ever going to shoot what I needed to shoot to win but it's disappointing. Hit in the water on the second and then made a bogey; it was a pretty good bogey at the end. Just hit a normal putt probably a foot further than you want to hit it, and missed it coming back and sets the tone for the day really. It was a 4-putt if you count the first putt. Technically could be a 3-putt but I count it as a 4-putt.

Q. And on the shot that went in the water on No. 2, did you hit 6-iron?

GEOFF OGILVY: Yeah, I do that all the time. I should have just aimed it at the pin which is the wrong place to hit it but when I came right of the pin, my body wants to pull it. It's a weird situation. You can't aim at that pin, but if you aim it right every now and then on your backswing, your mind will think about the pin and you pull it and it goes into the water. It was a 4-putt in the end.

Q. Do you say to yourself, it was a bad day, or what do you say to yourself, this bloke is going to win by a million anyways?

GEOFF OGILVY: It would be rude to say I was going to shoot 10-under. It was probably the best round he played all week. This is a better round than he played yesterday. It's windy and those last few holes are no gimmie. The greens

are getting a bit spikier and stuff. 13 was playing long, 12 was playing long. It's a pretty good round he's shot.

Q. After what he's done at the British and here, is it more impressive when you consider how he played yesterday that all the putts went in?

GEOFF OGILVY: It's probably an advantage to be able to hit less club off the tee. There's not many people that can shoot 8-under or whatever he shot, 4-under, on every par 4, he's just one of best, maybe is the best of all time. That's hard to beat.
